On behalf of the Metropolitan Planning Commission, the following item, referred to the Commission as required by the Metro Charter, has been recommended for *approval* to the Metropolitan Council:

A request to amend Council ordinance BL2023-1746 and Proposal No. 2023M-003ES-001 for the purpose of accepting an additional 86 linear feet of 8-inch water main, 4 linear feet of sixinch water main, and one fire hydrant assembly (see sketch for details) to serve the Clifton Triangle development. Proposed construction will occur entirely with public rights-of-way.

The relevant Metro agencies (Metro Parks, Metro Public Works, Metro Water Services, Metro Emergency Communications, the Nashville Electric Service, Metro Finance – Public Property and the Metro Historical Commission) have reviewed the proposal and concur in the recommendation for approval.
