RESOLUTION NO. _____

A resolution accepting a grant from the State of Tennessee, Department of Environment and Conservation, to the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Metropolitan Department of Water and Sewerage Services Waste Division, to fund the purchase of curbside recycling carts and AI technology to pilot contamination identification.

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee, Department of Environment and Conservation, has awarded a grant in an amount to not to exceed \$189,568.38 and a required match of \$189,568.38; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the grant by and between the State of Tennessee, Department of Environment and Conservation, in an amount not to exceed \$189,568.38, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Department of Water and Sewerage Services Waste Division, to fund the purchase of curbside recycling carts and AI technology to pilot contamination identification, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved and accepted.



Application Approval Letter

Dear Mayor O'Connell:

The Division of Solid Waste Management (DSWM), Materials Management Program (MMP), Grants Administration has completed the review of the Rebate Applications for FY25 and are offering the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County a proportionate share of such funds.

Per T.C.A. §68-211-825 (b), For the five (5) most populous counties according to the annual estimated census released in April by the United States census bureau, the State shall grant a rebate against the amount due to the State under the State surcharge on the tipping fee imposed by this part. The State shall rebate the amount of a county's credit to the county on an annual basis. Municipalities that manage solid waste within the five (5) counties shall be offered a proportionate share of their county's rebate, based on population.

As stipulated in T.C.A. §68-211-825 (b), the funds made available in the Recycling Rebate shall be allocated for "recycling purposes" including, but not limited to, purchasing equipment used to process recyclable materials and reduce solid waste. A total of \$750,000.00 has been allocated to proportionately distribute across all "Top 5" counties in the following manner:

$$\text{Rebate} = \frac{(\text{Total Population of County})}{(\text{Total Population of Five Most Populous Counties}) \times (100\% \text{ of State Funds Allocated for Recycling Equipment Grants})}$$

Eligible expenses are those that are incurred from **January 1, 2025**, through **December 31, 2025**. Rebate recipients must expend from local funds an amount equal to the amount of the Recycling Rebate towards such purposes. FY25 Recycling Rebate for the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County shall not exceed **\$189,568.38**.
