## RELEASE

This Release ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County ("Metropolitan Government") and Jerry A. Gingerich and Judith Ellen Gingerich, owners of property located at 2124 Oakwood Avenue, Nashville, TN, 37207.

## I. RECITALS

WHEREAS, Jerry A. Gingerich and Judith Ellen Gingerich (Revocable Trust Agreement of Jerry A. Gingerich and Judith Ellen Gingerich, Inst. 20230410-0025459, Davidson County Register of Deeds, RODC) are the owners of real property encumbered by a water pumping station building in a utility easement on this property as shown on Lot 287 of the plat of Shepardwood Section 3, Book 4660, Page 186, RODC; and,

WHEREAS, the water pumping station has been removed and the building is no longer being used by the Department of Water and Sewerage Services (MWS); and,

WHEREAS, Mr. & Mrs. Gingerich have requested permission to retain the pumping station building for storage use.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises, undertakings, obligations, and commitments hereinafter set forth, and intending to be legally bound, the Parties do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

## II. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>Metropolitan Government's Agreement</u>. The Metropolitan Government agrees to abandon the pumping station building. However, MWS retains all easement rights shown on the plat above for the sanitary sewer main that traverses the west side of property.
- 2. Jerry A. Gingerich and Judith Ellen Gingerich Agreement. Jerry A. Gingerich and Judith Ellen Gingerich hereby agree to take ownership of the pumping station building described herein, and hereby assume any and all risks of injury, death, or property damage arising out of or in any way connected with the pumping station building. Further, we agree to mow the grass and maintain the area around the building. On behalf of ourselves, our heirs, next of kin, family, relatives, guardians, conservators, executors, administrators, trustees and assigns, to the fullest extent provided by law, we hereby waive, release, and forever discharge in advance, and agree not to bring suit against, indemnify, and hold harmless, the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County ("Metropolitan Government"), its officers, employees, and volunteers from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands, and causes of action of any kind on account of any loss, damage, illness or injury to ourselves or our property, in any way arising out of or relating to the pumping station building whether due to negligence, mistake, or other action, inaction, or omission, or other legal fault of the Metropolitan Government, or its officers, employees, or volunteers, or the care, maintenance, or intended use of the pumping station building.
