Dear Members of the Parks Board:

We represent Friends of McCabe Park, an unincorporated group of citizens residing in the neighborhoods surrounding McCabe Park.

We write today to request permission to raise up to \$400,000 and to implement two projects in McCabe Park - (1) a renovation and expansion of the playground at the McCabe Park Community Center and (2) an investment in beautification, landscaping, and equipment upgrades for the McCabe Park Community Center.

We will partner with the Nashville Parks Foundation to raise funds, and Nashville Parks Foundation will work with Metro Parks to complete the improvements. Louise Bryan at NPF has been an incredible partner and guide in our efforts so far. We are enormously thankful for her time and support.

We gathered significant community feedback to select playground improvements and beautification as our two fundraising priorities. We have conducted an online survey with more than 125 responses from frequent users of McCabe Park, asking people for feedback about how they use the park and how it can be improved. We have included the results from that survey with this submission. We have also met with or distributed our survey to many community and parks leaders to get their input on McCabe's needs including:

- Louise Bryan, CEO of the Nashville Parks Foundation (letter of support attached)
- Amy Crownover, Executive Director of Greenways for Nashville
- Phil Luckett, Director of Consolidated Maintenance for Metro Parks
- Anthony Cooper, Facility Coordinator, McCabe Park Community Center
- Marie Campbell and Ryan Jackwood of Harpeth Conservancy
- Neighborhood Associations for Sylvan Park, The Nations, Sylvan Heights, Cherokee Park, and Richland-West End (all of whom have either invited us to present at a meeting or distributed our survey to their members)
- Leadership from Friends Groups supporting other Nashville-area parks including Warner (Jenny Hannon), Centennial (John Tumminello), Shelby (Rebecca Ratz), and Green Hills

We appreciate all these community leaders' willingness to meet with us and invest time in this project!

Across our survey and our conversations, we have heard consistent support for playground expansion and community center improvements at McCabe. McCabe's playground gets tons of use from nearby families, but the current footprint is too small and lacks equipment for children under five. The lack of shade structures or lighting also limits the playgrounds usefulness in summer and winter months. We have met with Phil Luckett, Director of Consolidated Maintenance, who indicated support for the project



and has suggested a budget of approximately \$350,000 to accomplish meaningful improvement and expansion at the playground.

We also heard strong support for beautification, maintenance, and equipment upgrades at the McCabe Park Community Center both from neighbors and from Anthony Cooper at the Community Center. We are thrilled that Metro Parks has recently planted several new trees around the Center. We are excited to raise funds to support further reinvestment in partnership with Community Center leadership. We have consulted with the landscape architects (Hawkins Partners) that did the original design work for the Community Center and and are confident that we can find a landscaping solution that looks good while keeping maintenance as simple and low-touch as possible. We also have a good list of needs from the Community Center team that we can support as part of the overall program.




# COMMUNITY OUTREACH SUMMARY

- We've launched a community outreach survey with >125 responses
- We would like permission to raise up to \$400,000 to focus on two of the community priorities identified by our outreach in partnership with the Nashville Parks Foundation:
  - **(1)** Approximately **50,000** for **beautification, landscaping, and equipment investments** around the McCabe Park Community center.
  - (2) Approximately \$350,000 for playground renovation and expansion at the community center.





# CLEAR, COMMUNITY-IDENTIFIED OPPORTUNITIES FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN THE PARK (VERBATIM FEEDBACK ON KEY PRIORITIES TO FOLLOW)

Which improvements would you like to see in McCabe Park?

Support for benches, trash, and water around the Greenway. There is an existing plan to renovate Greenway trailheads that we think will solve much of the feedback we heard



# **TOP PRIORITY: PLAYGROUND IMPROVEMENTS**

• Lots of demand for **playground improvements** (e.g. More equipment, shade, fencing from the street, etc.)

"More/improved playground space for littler kids + bigger kids"

"Improve the playground and add additional equipment for younger children. Because of the proximity to the road and the limited sight lines because of the buildings and trees it should be fenced in. The surface material needs to be leveled. There is a need for additional table space/shade structure."

Safety concerns about the current community center playground

"The playground is...not big enough for as many people frequent it and the slides are unsafe - way too steep."

"There is **one piece of the playground** by the community center that **looks like a slide but isn't and is dangerous to kids**. I'd love to see it removed or replaced for safety."

# TOP PRIORITY: COMMUNITY CENTER BEAUTIFICATION AND OTHER IMPROVEMENTS

 Many responses indicated a need for more investment in landscaping around the Community Center. We also view this as a potential 'visible quick win' that would help us get momentum for the larger playground project.

"Better landscaping and landscape maintenance please!"

"Community Center maintenance and landscaping could really use to be improved."

"The rain garden outside the community center looks a bit sad today. It could be such a nice way to enter an otherwise beautiful public space."

In addition to survey feedback, Anthony Cooper and his team at the Community Center
pulled together a list of small beautification, equipment and miscellaneous improvements
that they need and have heard strong support for from Community Center users.

# TOP PRIORITY: MORE INFRASTRUCTURE ALONG THE GREENWAY

• Clear need for more basic infrastructure (e.g. benches, garbage, water fountains) especially on the White Bridge side of the greenway. (Note: we are speaking to parks about the logistical feasibility of these suggestions — e.g. can trash be collected from points without road access)

"More trash cans at intersecting points on the Greenway i.e. where people hop on at Cherokee, where the route that takes you to Trader Joe's connects, and the route that takes you to Nashville State connects."

"It would be nice to have water fountains on the other side too..."

"More trash cans and more regular trash pickup are much needed. Cans are often overflowing with dog poop bags and get pretty odorous in the heat."

Note: While this was a clear priority in the community feedback, we are not including it in our initial project scope because we understand that there is an ongoing project to renovate Greenway trailheads at McCabe. We think that will address some of the concerns we heard, and we plan to work with Greenways for Nashville on this issue rather than take it on ourselves.
