On behalf of the Metropolitan Planning Commission, the following item, referred to the Commission as required by the Metro Charter, has been recommended for *approval* to the Metropolitan Council:

A request for the abandonment of approximately y 2,466 linear feet of six-inch water main and three fire hydrant assemblies and the acceptance of approximately 2,528 linear feet of eight-inch water main (DIP) and five fire hydrant assemblies to serve the Church Street Residences development.

The relevant Metro agencies (Metro Parks, Metro Public Works, Metro Water Services, Metro Emergency Communications, the Nashville Electric Service, Metro Finance – Public Property and the Metro Historical Commission) have reviewed the proposal and concur in the recommendation for approval.
