**Program Description:**

This grant of \$11,600 is being provided by the Centennial Park Conservancy to MHC, with the Metro Historical Commission Foundation acting as the pass-thru. These funds will go towards a project in progress that is also being funded by a grant through the Department of Interior via the Tennessee Historical Commission. There is no match or other funding required of Metro related to acceptance of the \$11,600. This project includes a survey, conditions assessment and a materials analysis of four early 20th century, cast-concrete structures in Nashville's Centennial Park. It will also include a conditions assessment with recommendations for repair for the Parthenon. The early concrete structures that are a part of the grant include two architectural follies designed by Major E.C. Lewis, an engineer and prominent civic leader who helped plan the park, Shell Spring (1906) and the Gunboat Tennessee Monument (1910), and two c. 1910 cast-concrete vehicular bridges.

Dear Tim:

We are thrilled that the MHC was awarded the 2020-2021 Tennessee Historical Commission (THC) preservation grant to assess the historic concrete structures in Centennial Park. As discussed, this project includes assessment, materials analysis, developing a priority list, and recommendations for two historic concrete bridges (c. 1910 Bridge at Lick Branch and c. 1910 Concrete Bridge) and two historic concrete follies (c. 1910 *Gunboat Tennessee* and c. 1912 Shell Spring) with an estimated cost of \$23,000. It also includes a conditions assessment and priority list for repair recommendations for the Parthenon, with an estimated cost of \$6,000, for a total project cost of \$29,000.

We understand that grant fund from THC will cover \$17,400 (60% of the total project costs) and that \$11,600 (40% of the total project costs) must be provided locally for the matching share. The MHCF has received \$11,600 from the Conservancy for Centennial Park to cover the required 40% matching share for this grant. In turn, MHCF is granting this \$11,600 to MHC for payments to be made under this project. This is a straight grant from MHCF to MHC, with no match or other funding required on Metro's part.




