REQUEST FOR IN-KIND GRANT APPROVAL - MCCABE PARK LITTLE LEAGUE

Please accept this letter as McCabe Park Little League's ("MPLL") request to provide an in-kind grant for improvements to at McCabe Park, valued at \$29,596. This improvement of a new batting cage next to the McCabe Park "big baseball field" is located near the McCabe Community Center at 101 46th Ave N.

McCabe Park Little League reserves space from Metro Parks to provide two seasons of baseball for over 500 Nashville youth ranging in age from three to twelve. The league uses both fields and one batting cage near McCabe Community Center. During season play, both fields are used from 8:00 AM to dark on Saturday, from noon to 5:00 PM on Sunday, and after school each weekday for practice. The current batting cage near right field is regularly used during practices and pre-game warmups and is commonly at capacity as there may be anywhere from two to four teams needing using the cage at any given time.

These changes will make the baseball facility more useful and improve the league's ability to develop young players. Adding a second batting cage will expand the league's ability to conduct practice events so teams on each of the two fields will have access to one cage. Teams warming up before games will also have to compete less for cage time before games begin.

We anticipate work being completed after all necessary Metro Parks and Council approvals are granted. An 811 review has confirmed that this work does not conflict with any utilities in the proposed project area. No matching funds will be required from Metro Parks as McCabe Park Little League will cover all expenses associated with this improvement project, and will also cover future costs of maintenance related to the batting cage. We have included some additional information below about the league for your review and kindly request your approval of this in-kind grant. Should you have any additional questions, we would be happy to respond.

Short summary of the organization

McCabe Park Little League is a volunteer-led, non-profit organization that has served youth in the Sylvan Park neighborhood of Nashville TN since 1986. Operating under the charter of Little League, the board of directors, without paid staff, runs youth baseball divisions ranging from tee ball to twelve-year-olds.

Over the last three decades, the organization has consistently served as a family-friendly, accepting, and safe place for kids of all ages and skill levels to find a home and a place to learn and play the great game of baseball. Children come from a diverse background of schools in the surrounding neighborhoods and learn to participate in teams organized with a focus on parity and community, not championships.

Short description of the proposed project and objectives

• Install a batting cage of chain-link fencing or similar material approximately 18 feet wide, 12 feet tall, and 65 feet long for a batting cage. The cage will include a concrete or aggregate foundation pad for the width of the proposed cage plus approximately one foot. The interior of the fence line and roof will have black nylon netting. The cage is to be installed along the left field fence of the large McCabe ballfield just beyond the third base dugout, between the left field fence and the existing sidewalk.
