# GRANT CONTRACT BETWEEN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND CONSERVATION AND METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY

This grant contract ("Grant Contract"), by and between the State of Tennessee, Department of Environment and Conservation, hereinafter referred to as the "State" or the "Grantor State Agency" and Grantee Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee," is for the provision of organics management, as further defined in the "SCOPE OF SERVICES AND DELIVERABLES."

#### A. SCOPE OF SERVICES AND DELIVERABLES:

- A.1. The Grantee shall provide the scope of services and deliverables ("Scope") as required, described, and detailed in this Grant Contract.
- A.2. <u>Title VI Certification</u>. The Grantee is required to retain a Title VI training program within the Organization. The Grantee shall submit Title VI training verification to the State within thirty (30) days of this Grant Contract's execution and before requesting the Grantee's first payment.
- A.3. <u>Project Pre-Implementation Meeting</u>. The Grantee shall attend a mandatory pre-implementation project review meeting wherein Grant Contract expectations and scopes will be reviewed and explained, and a presentation of accountability for attaining said expectations will be explained before any work commences.
- A.4. <u>Grants Management System</u>. The Grantee shall utilize the Grants Management System (GMS) online portal to complete all relevant grant actions.
- A.5. <u>Planning</u>. The Grantee shall adhere to the approved timetable submitted in its application. If deviation from this timetable becomes necessary, the Grantee shall submit a written request to the State pursuant to Section A.6.
  - a. The Grantee's plans shall include, but are not limited to: location, expenses for location, staff requirements, shelters and other facilities for attendants, transportation arrangements, storage requirements, feedstock sources, etc.
  - A timetable for this project should specify key milestones such as appropriate bidding process, construction start date or date of project commencement, installation of equipment (if applicable), and completion date.
  - c. The Grantee shall submit bid package for approval within sixty (60) days of permit approval in accordance with local government bidding practices. No purchases will be funded until approved by Grantor State Agency staff.
  - d. Proposed operational plan must include hours of operation, organic materials targeted, and staffing cost.
- A.6. Permissible Exceptions. The Grantee shall meet timeline deadlines and deliverable expectations set out in the Grantee's application, but should it be necessary, the State may alter and modify expectations to a mutually agreeable new timeline so long as there is no major impact to the general scope of services and final deliverables. The Grantee shall request such an alteration or modification in writing, signed, and on appropriate letterhead, to

- revise dates relative to this project timeline due to unforeseen circumstances. Approval from the State must be in writing and signed prior to extending or modifying dates.
- A.7. Notice of Violation. Should the Grantee receive a Notice of Violation for any reason from the State related to the site subject to this Grant Contract, the Grantee must deliver a copy of the Notice of Violation to the contact listed in Section D.8. of the Grant Contract within two (2) weeks of receiving the violation.
- A.8. <u>Site Preparation for Equipment</u>. The Grantee shall make all site preparation in accordance with the approved project timeline. Site preparation must comply with all local, state, and federal rules and statutes. Additionally, the Grantee must comply with permit conditions for site preparation. Inspection of site must be completed by Grantor State Agency technical staff prior to proceeding with Section A.8. to ensure Grantee is ready for installation of all necessary items and/or equipment requested under the grant application process.
- A.9. <u>Installation</u>. The Grantee may proceed with installation after Sections A.2 through A.8 have been completed and approved by the State. All equipment or materials shall be purchased and installed by **May 31, 2025.** 
  - a. The Grantee shall order equipment or materials within **two (2) weeks** of receiving approval of bid packages in accordance with Section A.5.c.
  - b. Installation shall be in accordance with the approved project plan timeline.
  - c. The Grantee shall install equipment within **thirty (30) days** of delivery to the site.
  - d. All equipment shall be entered into the county inventory and identified with appropriate tags.
  - e. All equipment serial numbers shall be easily accessed and match inventory controls.
- A.10. <u>Staffing and Operation Manual</u>. The Grantee shall develop, print, and update operation manuals for operations and procedures associated with activities funding by the grant. The Grantee shall:
  - a. Train staff in operation, use of items, equipment, and then establish and implement a program to retain training files for term of grant. Grantees requesting equipment for composting or anaerobic digestion operations shall be certified in composting by a nationally recognized organization like Solid Waste Association of North America (SWANA) or the US Composting Council within six (6) months of receiving the grant for operational facilities. The Grantee will train and certify new employees within the same noted sixmonths timeframe.
  - b. Provide appropriate signage for safety, usage, and operational guidelines.
  - c. Develop and print educational materials and provide to the public on the benefits of the facility or project.
- A.11. <u>Final Inspection</u>. Once Sections A.2 through A.10 are completed, and the facility and installed equipment are ready for operation and meet the terms of the permit, the Grantee shall submit a request for an inspection to the State for an on-site or virtual inspection.
  - a. The Grantee shall request a State inspection within **two (2) weeks** of installation through the GMS portal.

- b. All equipment shall be operational at the time of a final inspection.
- c. All equipment shall be routinely maintained, cleaned, and serviced with accessible maintenance logs for the term of the Grant Contract.
- A.12. Final Inspection for Education and Outreach Based Grant. The Grantee shall contact the Grantor State Agency for final inspection once SectionA.1 through A.10.are completed and the project is ready for operation. As part of the Staffing and Operation Manual, education and outreach-based projects must include sections inventorying, if applicable, all items awarded as part of this grant, maintenance schedules for these items, plans for long term upkeep, and other beneficial information that will help preserve the integrity of the items and equipment received as a result of the grant.
- A.13. Reimbursement. The Grantee shall proceed with a request for grant reimbursement submission in the GMS portal after Sections A.2 through A.12. have been completed and approved by the State.
  - a. The Grantee shall submit a request for grant reimbursement within **thirty (30) days** of receiving State approval of inspection via the GMS portal.
  - A final request for grant reimbursement shall be submitted by June 30, 2025.
- A.14. Reporting. The Grantee shall report the amount of organic material managed, in terms of materials recovered and diverted, or if the project is education based, the number of citizens and households impacted by the project. The Grantee shall report to the local solid waste region this information for inclusion in Region's Annual Progress Report (APR). The Grantee shall submit to the Region by March 1 of each year for the previous calendar year. The Region will submit the APR to the Grantor State Agency no later than March 31 of each calendar year during the term of this grant.
  - a. Grantee(s) must agree to report the above referenced required information to their respective Region for inclusion in their APR for two (2) years after the contract end date.
- A.15. Signage. The Grantee shall post a sign of at least 1" Letters in a prominent location stating, "This project was funded under an organics management grant from the State of Tennessee, Department of Environment and Conservation."
- A.16. <u>Safety</u>. The Grantee agrees to operate all equipment in accordance with the manufacturer's operational standards. The Grantee further agrees not to modify or defeat safety devices, appurtenances, and procedures engineered by the manufacturer to protect operators and bystanders.
- A.17. <u>Failure to Progress</u>. If the grant-funded project does not progress for a period of six (6) months and is determined by the State to be inactive, the State may initiate termination of this

Grant Contract for convenience in accordance with Section D.3. "Inactivity" is defined as the Grantee failing to demonstrate effective project activity towards completion or meet project milestones during any six (6) month period of this Grant Contract.

- A.18. <u>Timing of Progress Reports</u>. As required by Section D.17, the Grantee shall submit progress activity reports on a quarterly basis. These quarterly progress reporting activities shall, at a minimum, contain a summary of current project actions and upcoming actions.
- A.19. <u>Incorporation of Additional Documents</u>. Each of the following documents is included as a part of this Grant Contract by reference or attachment. In the event of a discrepancy or ambiguity regarding the Grantee's duties, responsibilities, and performance hereunder, these items shall govern in order of precedence below:
  - a. this Grant Contract document with any attachments or exhibits (excluding the items listed at Subsections b.and c.);
  - the Grantee's grant application;
  - c. Contract Fulfillment Letter, upon completion of Sections A.2 through A.18.

#### B. TERM OF CONTRACT:

This Grant Contract shall be effective on July 1, 2024 ("Effective Date") and extend for a period of sixty (60) months after the Effective Date ("Term"). The State shall have no obligation to the Grantee for fulfillment of the Scope outside the Term.

#### C. PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- C.1. <u>Maximum Liability</u>. In no event shall the maximum liability of the State under this Grant Contract exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$100,000.00) ("Maximum Liability"). The Grant Budget, attached and incorporated as Attachment 1 is the maximum amount due the Grantee under this Grant Contract. The Grant Budget line-items include, but are not limited to, all applicable taxes, fees, overhead, and all other direct and indirect costs incurred or to be incurred by the Grantee.
- C.2. <u>Compensation Firm</u>. The Maximum Liability of the State is not subject to escalation for any reason unless amended. The Grant Budget amounts are firm for the duration of the Grant Contract and are not subject to escalation for any reason unless amended, except as provided in Section C.6.
- C.3. Payment Methodology. The Grantee shall be reimbursed for actual, reasonable, and necessary costs based upon the Grant Budget, not to exceed the Maximum Liability established in Section C.1. Upon progress toward the completion of the Scope, as described in Section A of this Grant Contract, the Grantee shall submit invoices prior to any reimbursement of allowable costs.
- C.4. <u>Travel Compensation</u>. Reimbursement to the Grantee for travel, meals, or lodging shall be subject to amounts and limitations specified in the "State Comprehensive Travel Regulations," as they are amended from time to time, and shall be contingent upon and limited by the Grant Budget funding for said reimbursement.
- C.5. <u>Invoice Requirements</u>. The Grantee shall invoice the State no more often than monthly, with all necessary supporting documentation, and present such to:

- a. Each invoice shall clearly and accurately detail all of the following required information (calculations must be extended and totaled correctly).
  - (1) Invoice/Reference Number (assigned by the Grantee).
  - (2) Invoice Date.
  - (3) Invoice Period (to which the reimbursement request is applicable).
  - (4) Grant Contract Number (assigned by the State).
  - (5) Grantor: Department of Environmental and Conservation,

Division of Solid Waste Management

Materials Management Program, Grants Administration

- (6) Grantor Number (assigned by the Grantee to the above-referenced Grantor).
- (7) Grantee Name.
- (8) Grantee Tennessee Edison Registration ID Number Referenced in Preamble of this Grant Contract.
- (9) Grantee Remittance Address.
- (10) Grantee Contact for Invoice Questions (name, phone, or fax).
- (11) Itemization of Reimbursement Requested for the Invoice Period— it must detail, at minimum, all of the following:
  - i. The amount requested by Grant Budget line-item (including any travel expenditure reimbursement requested and for which documentation and receipts, as required by "State Comprehensive Travel Regulations," are attached to the invoice).
  - ii. The amount reimbursed by Grant Budget line-item to date.
  - iii. The total amount reimbursed under the Grant Contract to date.
  - iv. The total amount requested (all line-items) for the Invoice Period.
- b. The Grantee understands and agrees to all of the following.
  - (1) An invoice under this Grant Contract shall include only reimbursement requests for actual, reasonable, and necessary expenditures required in the delivery of service described by this Grant Contract and shall be subject to the Grant Budget and any other provision of this Grant Contract relating to allowable reimbursements.
  - (2) An invoice under this Grant Contract shall not include any reimbursement request for future expenditures.
  - (3) An invoice under this Grant Contract shall initiate the timeframe for reimbursement only when the State is in receipt of the invoice, and the invoice meets the minimum requirements of this section C.5.
- C.6. <u>Budget Line-items</u>. Expenditures, reimbursements, and payments under this Grant Contract shall adhere to the Grant Budget. The Grantee may vary from a Grant Budget line-item amount by up to one percent (1%) of the line-item amount, provided that any increase is off-set by an equal reduction of other line-item amount(s) such that the net result of variances shall not increase the total Grant Contract amount detailed by the Grant Budget. Any increase in the Grant Budget, grand total amounts shall require an amendment of this Grant Contract.

- C.7. <u>Disbursement Reconciliation and Close Out</u>. The Grantee shall submit any final invoice and a grant disbursement reconciliation report within sixty (60) days of the Grant Contract end date, in form and substance acceptable to the State.
  - a. If total disbursements by the State pursuant to this Grant Contract exceed the amounts permitted by the section C, payment terms and conditions of this Grant Contract, the Grantee shall refund the difference to the State. The Grantee shall submit the refund with the final grant disbursement reconciliation report.
  - b. The State shall not be responsible for the payment of any invoice submitted to the State after the grant disbursement reconciliation report. The State will not deem any Grantee costs submitted for reimbursement after the grant disbursement reconciliation report to be allowable and reimbursable by the State, and such invoices will NOT be paid.
  - c. The Grantee's failure to provide a final grant disbursement reconciliation report to the State as required by this Grant Contract shall result in the Grantee being deemed ineligible for reimbursement under this Grant Contract, and the Grantee shall be required to refund any and all payments by the State pursuant to this Grant Contract.
  - d. The Grantee must close out its accounting records at the end of the Term in such a way that reimbursable expenditures and revenue collections are NOT carried forward.
- C.8. Indirect Cost. Should the Grantee request reimbursement for indirect costs, the Grantee must submit to the State a copy of the indirect cost rate approved by the cognizant federal agency or the cognizant state agency, as applicable. The Grantee will be reimbursed for indirect costs in accordance with the approved indirect cost rate and amounts and limitations specified in the attached Grant Budget. Once the Grantee makes an election and treats a given cost as direct or indirect, it must apply that treatment consistently and may not change during the Term. Any changes in the approved indirect cost rate must have prior approval of the cognizant federal agency or the cognizant state agency, as applicable. If the indirect cost rate is provisional during the Term, once the rate becomes final, the Grantee agrees to remit any overpayment of funds to the State, and subject to the availability of funds the State agrees to remit any underpayment to the Grantee.
- C.9. <u>Cost Allocation</u>. If any part of the costs to be reimbursed under this Grant Contract are joint costs involving allocation to more than one program or activity, such costs shall be allocated and reported in accordance with the provisions of Central Procurement Office Policy Statement 2013-007 or any amendments or revisions made to this policy statement during the Term.
- C.10. <u>Payment of Invoice</u>. A payment by the State shall not prejudice the State's right to object to or question any reimbursement, invoice, or related matter. A payment by the State shall not be construed as acceptance of any part of the work or service provided or as approval of any amount as an allowable cost.
- C.11. Non-allowable Costs. Any amounts payable to the Grantee shall be subject to reduction for amounts included in any invoice or payment that are determined by the State, on the basis of audits or monitoring conducted in accordance with the terms of this Grant Contract, to constitute unallowable costs.
- C.12. <u>State's Right to Set Off.</u> The State reserves the right to set off or deduct from amounts that are or shall become due and payable to the Grantee under this Grant Contract or under any other agreement between the Grantee and the State of Tennessee under which the Grantee has a right to receive payment from the State.
- C.13. <u>Prerequisite Documentation</u>. The Grantee shall not invoice the State under this Grant Contract until the State has received the following, properly completed documentation.

- a. The Grantee shall complete, sign, and return to the State an "Authorization Agreement for Automatic Deposit (ACH Credits) Form" provided by the State. By doing so, the Grantee acknowledges and agrees that, once this form is received by the State, all payments to the Grantee under this or any other grant contract will be made by automated clearing house ("ACH").
- b. The Grantee shall complete, sign, and return to the State the State-provided W-9 form. The taxpayer identification number on the W-9 form must be the same as the Grantee's Federal Employer Identification Number or Social Security Number referenced in the Grantee's Edison registration information.

#### D. STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- D.1. Required Approvals. The State is not bound by this Grant Contract until it is signed by the parties and approved by appropriate officials in accordance with applicable Tennessee laws and regulations (depending upon the specifics of this Grant Contract, the officials may include, but are not limited to, the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, the Commissioner of Human Resources, and the Comptroller of the Treasury).
- D.2. Modification and Amendment. This Grant Contract may be modified only by a written amendment signed by all parties and approved by the officials who approved the Grant Contract and, depending upon the specifics of the Grant Contract as amended, any additional officials required by Tennessee laws and regulations (the officials may include, but are not limited to, the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, the Commissioner of Human Resources, and the Comptroller of the Treasury).
- D.3. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>. The State may terminate this Grant Contract without cause for any reason. A termination for convenience shall not be a breach of this Grant Contract by the State. The State shall give the Grantee at least thirty (30) days written notice before the effective termination date. The Grantee shall be entitled to compensation for authorized expenditures and satisfactory services completed as of the termination date, but in no event shall the State be liable to the Grantee for compensation for any service that has not been rendered. The final decision as to the amount for which the State is liable shall be determined by the State. The Grantee shall not have any right to any actual general, special, incidental, consequential, or any other damages whatsoever of any description or amount for the State's exercise of its right to terminate for convenience.
- D.4. <u>Termination for Cause</u>. If the Grantee fails to properly perform its obligations under this Grant Contract, or if the Grantee violates any terms of this Grant Contract, the State shall have the right to immediately terminate this Grant Contract and withhold payments in excess of fair compensation for completed services. Notwithstanding the exercise of the State's right to terminate this Grant Contract for cause, the Grantee shall not be relieved of liability to the State for damages sustained by virtue of any breach of this Grant Contract by the Grantee.
- D.5. <u>Subcontracting</u>. The Grantee shall not assign this Grant Contract or enter into a subcontract for any of the services performed under this Grant Contract without obtaining the prior written approval of the State. If such subcontracts are approved by the State, each shall contain, at a minimum, sections of this Grant Contract pertaining to "Conflicts of Interest," "Lobbying," "Nondiscrimination," "Public Accountability," "Public Notice," and "Records" (as identified by the section headings). Notwithstanding any use of approved subcontractors, the Grantee shall remain responsible for all work performed.
- D.6. <u>Conflicts of Interest</u>. The Grantee warrants that no part of the total Grant Contract Amount shall be paid directly or indirectly to an employee or official of the State of Tennessee as wages, compensation, or gifts in exchange for acting as an officer, agent, employee, subcontractor, or

consultant to the Grantee in connection with any work contemplated or performed relative to this Grant Contract.

- D.7. <u>Lobbying</u>. The Grantee certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief, that:
  - a. - D.9. <u>Subject to Funds Availability</u>. This Grant Contract is subject to the appropriation and availability of State or Federal funds. In the event that the funds are not appropriated or are otherwise unavailable, the State reserves the right to terminate this Grant Contract upon written notice to the Grantee. The State's right to terminate this Grant Contract due to lack of funds is not a breach of this Grant Contract by the State. Upon receipt of the written notice, the Grantee shall cease all work associated with the Grant Contract. Should such an event occur, the Grantee shall be entitled to compensation for all satisfactory and authorized services completed as of the termination date. Upon such termination, the Grantee shall have no right to recover from the State any actual, general, special, incidental, consequential, or any other damages whatsoever of any description or amount.
- D.10. Nondiscrimination. All notices by the Grantee in relation to this Grant Contract shall be approved by the State.
- D.14. <u>Licensure</u>. The Grantee, its employees, and any approved subcontractor shall be licensed pursuant to all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations and shall upon request provide proof of all licenses.
- D.15. Records. The Grantee and any approved subcontractor shall maintain documentation for all charges under this Grant Contract. For grant contracts with multiyear terms, the final report will take the place of the annual report for the final year of the Term. The Grantee shall submit annual and final reports to the Grantor State Agency. At minimum, annual and final reports shall include: (a) the Grantee's name; (b) the Grant Contract's Edison identification number, Term, and total amount; (c) a narrative section that describes the program's goals, outcomes, successes and setbacks, whether the Grantee used benchmarks or indicators to determine progress, and whether any proposed activities were not completed; and (d) other relevant details requested by the Grantor State Agency. Annual and final report documents to be completed by the Grantee shall appear on the Grantor State Agency's website or as an attachment to the Grant Contract.
- D.19. Audit Report. The Grantee shall be audited in accordance with applicable Tennessee law.

At least ninety (90) days before the end of its fiscal year, the Grantee shall complete the Information for Audit Purposes ("IAP") form online (accessible through the Edison Supplier portal) to notify the State whether or not Grantee is subject to an audit. The Grantee should submit only one, completed form online during the Grantee's fiscal year. Immediately after the fiscal year has ended, the Grantee shall fill out the End of Fiscal Year ("EOFY") (accessible through the Edison Supplier portal).

When a federal single audit is required, the audit shall be performed in accordance with U.S. Office of Management and Budget's *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards*.

A copy of the audit report shall be provided to the Comptroller by the licensed, independent public accountant. Audit reports shall be made available to the public.

D.20. Procurement. If other terms of this Grant Contract allow reimbursement for the cost of goods, materials, supplies, equipment, or contracted services, such procurement shall be made on a competitive basis, including the use of competitive bidding procedures, where practical. The Grantee shall maintain documentation for the basis of each procurement for which reimbursement is paid pursuant to this Grant Contract. In each instance where it is determined that use of a competitive procurement method is not practical, supporting documentation shall include a written justification for the decision and for use of a non-competitive procurement. - D.22. Independent Contractor. The parties shall not act as employees, partners, joint venturers, or associates of one another in the performance of this Grant Contract. The parties acknowledge that they are independent contracting entities and that nothing in this Grant Contract shall be construed to create a principal/agent relationship or to allow either to exercise control or direction over the manner or method by which the other transacts its business affairs or provides its usual services. The employees or agents of one party shall not be deemed or construed to be the employees or agents of the other party for any purpose whatsoever.
- D.23. <u>Limitation of State's Liability</u>. The State shall have no liability except as specifically provided in this Grant Contract. In no event will the State be liable to the Grantee or any other party for any lost revenues, lost profits, loss of business, loss of grant funding, decrease in the value of any securities or cash position, time, money, goodwill, or any indirect, special, incidental, punitive, exemplary or consequential damages of any nature, whether based on warranty, contract, statute, regulation, tort (including but not limited to negligence), or any other legal theory that may arise under this Grant Contract or otherwise. The State's total liability under this Grant Contract (including any exhibits, schedules, amendments or other attachments to the Contract) or otherwise shall under no circumstances exceed the Maximum Liability originally established in Section C.1 of this Grant Contract. This limitation of liability is cumulative and not per incident.
- D.24. Force Majeure. "Force Majeure Event" means fire, flood, earthquake, elements of nature or acts of God, wars, riots, civil disorders, rebellions or revolutions, acts of terrorism or any other similar cause beyond the reasonable control of the party except to the extent that the non-performing party is at fault in failing to prevent or causing the default or delay, and provided that the default or delay cannot reasonably be circumvented by the non-performing party through the use of alternate sources, workaround plans or other means. A strike, lockout or labor dispute shall not excuse either party from its obligations under this Grant Contract. Except as set forth in this Section, any failure or delay by a party in the performance of its obligations under this Grant Contract arising from a Force Majeure Event is not a default under this Grant Contract or grounds for termination. The non-performing party will be excused from performing those obligations directly affected by the Force Majeure Event, and only for as long as the Force Majeure Event continues, provided that the party continues to use diligent, good faith efforts to resume performance without delay. The occurrence of a Force Majeure Event affecting Grantee's representatives, suppliers, subcontractors, customers or business apart from this Grant Contract is not a Force Majeure Event under this Grant Contract. Grantee will promptly notify the State of any delay caused by a Force Majeure Event (to be confirmed in a written notice to the State within one (1) day of the inception of the delay) that a Force Majeure Event has occurred, and will describe in reasonable detail the nature of the Force Majeure Event. The Grantee agrees that it will be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Tennessee in actions that may arise under this Grant Contract. The Grantee acknowledges and agrees that any rights or claims against the State of Tennessee or its employees hereunder, and any remedies arising there from, shall be subject to and limited to those rights and remedies, if any, available under Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 9-8-101 through 9-8-408.
- D.30. <u>Completeness</u>. This Grant Contract is complete and contains the entire understanding between the parties relating to the subject matter contained herein, including all the terms and conditions agreed to by the parties. This Grant Contract supersedes any and all prior understandings, representations, negotiations, or agreements between the parties, whether written or oral.
- D.31. <u>Severability</u>. If any terms and conditions of this Grant Contract are held to be invalid or unenforceable as a matter of law, the other terms and conditions shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect. To this end, the terms and conditions of this Grant Contract are declared severable.
- D.32. <u>Headings</u>. Section headings are for reference purposes only and shall not be construed as part of this Grant Contract.
- D.33. <u>Iran Divestment Act.</u> The requirements of Tenn. Code Ann. § 12-12-101, *et seq.*, addressing contracting with persons as defined at Tenn. Code Ann. §12-12-103(5) that engage in investment activities in Iran, shall be a material provision of this Grant Contract. The Grantee certifies, under penalty of perjury, that to the best of its knowledge and belief that it is not on the list created pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 12-12-106.
- D.34. <u>Debarment and Suspension.</u> The Grantee certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it, its current and future principals, its current and future subcontractors and their principals:
  - a. are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any federal or state department or agency;
  - b. have not within a three (3) year period preceding this Grant Contract been convicted of, or had a civil judgment rendered against them from commission of fraud, or a criminal offence in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) transaction or grant under a public transaction; violation of
