AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY AND KEVIN CRUMBO FOR THE DONATION AND DISPLAY OF ARTWORK

This agreement is entered into on this 17th day of February, 2022, by and between THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY, acting by and through the Metropolitan Arts Commission ("Metro") AND KEVIN CRUMBO ("Donor's Name") for the donation and display of eight artworks by artist LAUREN OSSOLINSKI ("Work").

- 1. Purpose. The purpose of this agreement is to donate the Work to Metro for installation and display in Historic Metro Courthouse or another Metro public location as included in Exhibit A.
- Duration. Donor agrees to irrevocably donate and convey title to Metro, and Metro agrees to accept from Donor, the Work as described and identified in Section 3 of this Agreement. Metro will endeavor to display the Work in a Metro public area that is accessible to the public.
- 3. Description of the Work

- 4. Condition of the Work. Donor shall donate the Work to Metro in good condition.
- 5. Donor's Warranty. Donor warrants that the Work is an original and that the Work does not infringe upon any copyright. Donor warrants that the Work is free and clear of any liens, claims, or encumbrances from any source whatsoever. Exclusive title to the Work shall vest in Metro upon execution of this Agreement. All of Donor's rights to the Work shall be transferred to Metro with this Agreement.
- 6. Compensation, There will be no charges or fees owed to Donor for the donation and display of the Work.
- 7. Acknowledgement of Receipt. If Donor elects to claim tax benefits associated with the donation of the Work, Metro agrees to provide Donor with a Deed of Gift and written acknowledgement of Metro's receipt of the donation, as included in Exhibits B and C of this Agreement. Metro makes no representations, warranties, or guaranties relating to the value or the tax implications of such donation.
- 8. Care and Preservation. Metro will endeavor to give the Work donated the same care as it does other comparable works of art in its possession. It is understood by both parties that all tangible objects are subject to gradual inherent deterioration for which neither party is responsible. Costs for the transportation, storage, installation, and maintenance of the Work are not anticipated.
- 9. Reproductions and Credit. Metro retains full rights of reproduction, filming, photography, for educational, procurement, public relations, arts promotional, tourism, and other non-commercial purposes. Metro retains full rights of removal, relocation, and deaccessioning of the Work. It is understood that the general public may photograph objects on exhibition in the public buildings of Metro.
- 10. No Restrictions on Use. Except with respect to state or federal laws regarding the preservation, copyright, and/or resale of works of art, the Work will be acquired without legal restrictions as to its future use.
- 11. Notices. Notices to Metro regarding this agreement shall be sent to:

- 12. Indemnification and Hold Harmless. DONOR shall indemnify and hold harmless Metro, its officers, agents, and employees from:
 - a. Any claims, damages, costs and attorney fees for injuries or damages arising, in part or in whole, from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of DONOR in connection with the performance of the contract.
 - b. Any claims, damages, penalties, costs and attorney fees arising from any failure of DONOR to observe applicable laws.

- c. Metro will not indemnify, defend or hold harmless in any fashion the DONOR from any claims arising from any failure, regardless of any language in any attachment or other document that the DONOR may provide.
- d. DONOR shall pay Metro any expenses incurred as a result of DONOR's failure to fulfill any obligation in a professional and timely manner under this contract.
- 13. Governing Law. The validity, construction, and effect of this contract and any and all extensions and/or modifications thereof shall be governed by the laws of the State of Tennessee, Tennessee law shall govern regardless of any language in any attachment or other document that the DONOR may provide.
- 14. Venue. Any action between the parties arising from this agreement shall be maintained in the courts of Davidson County, Tennessee.
- 15. Severability. Should any provision of this contract be declared to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be severed and shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this contract.
- 16. Effective Date. This contract shall not be binding upon the parties until it has been signed first by the Donor and then by the authorized representatives of the Metropolitan Government, has been filed in the office of the Metropolitan Clerk, and approved by the Metropolitan Council. When it has been so signed and filed, this contract shall be effective as of the date first written above.


