#### Dear Mayor Cooper:

In preparation for the FY 2023 HSGP award due in September, we are providing the following information for planning purposes to assist with the completion of the District Investment Justification (IJ). **This is not an award notice** – the funding allocation is based on the funding amounts provided in the FY 2023 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO - attached), and recommendation passed by the Governor's Homeland Security Council on March 6, 2023. The final award notice will be provided once Tennessee has been officially awarded the funds.

District 5 is tentatively scheduled to receive \$944,130.00 based on the state allocation and distribution method as voted on by the Governor's Homeland Security Council for HSGP funds. In addition to the HSGP funding, District 5 is also eligible for \$1,500,000.00 in UASI Funding. The Homeland Security Council voted to pass-through eighty-one percent (81%) of the funding as opposed to the eighty percent (80%) required by grant guidance; furthermore, this grant is a one hundred percent (100%) federally-funded reimbursement program.

These funds will be made available immediately upon receipt of the award contract from DHS/FEMA in September. At that time, should you choose to accept these funds, you will be required to submit an Acceptance Letter acknowledging the funding amount being awarded to your District, along with a breakdown of funding amounts for each county. The county breakdown will allow the state to draft contracts and have them available for execution within the forty-five (45) day passthrough requirement. To reiterate – you **do not** have to send an Acceptance Letter now, only when the State has received the funding from DHS/FEMA.

Attached, you will find the District IJ form for FY 2023. Please complete the form and return to Special Agent James Cotter *No Later Than May 5, 2023*, COB. District projects must support the following U.S. Department of Homeland Security approved National Priorities and be allowable under the grant guidelines and rules.

#### **National Priorities**

• Enhancing Community Preparedness and Resilience (minimum 3% spend)



- Enhancing the protection of soft targets/crowded places (minimum 3% spend)
- Enhancing Information & Intelligence sharing & cooperation with federal agencies (minimum 3% spend)
- Combating Domestic Violent Extremism (minimum 3% spend)
- Enhancing Cybersecurity (no minimum spend requirement)
- Enhancing Election Security (minimum 3% spend)

It should be noted that the overall spend requirement in the National Priority area must meet a **minimum** of 30% as a State (total grant). Furthermore, this grant also requires a **minimum** of thirty percent (35%) percent of the awarded funds are dedicated towards law enforcement terrorism **prevention-oriented** activities (LETPA). Due to the DHS/FEMA requirements and evaluation process (outlined in the NOFO on pages 44-48) the state does not have any state specific priorities. Districts shall spend their funding in these priority areas to ensure the State meets and/or exceeds the minimum spending amounts, which in turn, will ensure the State meets the evaluation requirements and receives the full award amount by the scheduled timelines.

The HSGP is an assistance program that provides funds to build capabilities at the state and local levels through planning, equipment, training, and exercise activities and to implement the goals and objectives of the State and Federal Homeland Security Strategies. Your District Homeland Security Council should develop a plan to best apply these funds toward projects that sustain existing capabilities and/or projects that can be completed without requiring extensive additional funding and benefits the district as a whole.
