Nashville Fire Department is requesting a new maritime boat with CBRNE capabilities. With Nashville growing at a fast rate fuel demand and consumption is at an all-time high and growing. 60% of this regions fuel is delivered by pipeline with the remaining 40% delivered by barge on the Cumberland river. With growing river traffic, the need for a CBRNE rated boat is required to meet any challenges or emergencies that might occur on the river with toxic or heavy smoke plumes.

Responses to facilities and events in the Port of Nashville require land based and waterborne assets capable of operating in both environments. Also, response personnel need to be able to address rapidly emerging security threats and to provide emergency medical first aid. Funding is requested for equipment to enhance current land based and maritime response capabilities by adding new capabilities and to enhance the capabilities of the recently formed Rescue Task Force concept, extended to a maritime environment.

The newly formed Helicopter Aquatic Rescue Team (HART) supports not just the citizens and property owners of Nashville Davidson County but surrounding counties and subsequently the entire state and neighboring states if requested. This capability is supported using aircraft from Tennessee Army National Guard (TANG) and Tennessee Highway Patrol (THP). Nashville Fire Department provides rescuers that routinely perform hoist missions rescuing wounded or stranded people in remote or inaccessible areas.
