



NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to abandon approximately 201 linear feet of eight-inch sanitary sewer main (VCP-lined), approximately 1,048 linear feet of existing eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), six sanitary sewer manholes and easements, and to accept approximately 100 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), approximately 2,065 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), 18 sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for property located at Spring Branch Drive (unnumbered), also known as Spring Branch Drive Subdivision, as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the abandonment and acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This ordinance abandons approximately 201 linear feet of eight-inch sanitary sewer main (VCP-lined), approximately 1,048 linear feet of existing eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), six sanitary sewer manholes and easements, and accepts approximately 100 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), approximately 2,065 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), 18 sanitary sewer manholes and easements for property located at Spring Branch Drive (unnumbered), also known as Spring Branch Drive Subdivision.

This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission. Future amendments to this ordinance may be approved by resolution.

*Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Abandoned and donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.*
