NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to abandon approximately 1,993 linear feet of existing 12-inch water main (DIP), approximately 251 linear feet of existing eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), approximately 222 linear feet of existing 18-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), four sanitary sewer manholes and easements, and to accept approximately 108 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), one new sanitary sewer manhole and easements, for six properties located at Victory Avenue, South 1st Street, Shelby Avenue, Woodland Street, Titans Way, and Russell Street, also known as the Nissan Stadium Infrastructure Project, as shown on Exhibits 1 and 2, which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the abandonment and acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This ordinance abandons approximately 1,993 linear feet of existing 12-inch water main (DIP), approximately 251 linear feet of existing eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), approximately 222 linear feet of existing 18-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), four sanitary sewer manholes and easements, and accepts approximately 108 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), one new sanitary sewer manhole and easements for six properties located at Victory Avenue, South 1st Street, Shelby Avenue, Woodland Street, Titans Way, and Russell Street, also known as the Nissan Stadium Infrastructure Project.

Future amendments to this legislation may be approved by resolution. This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission.

Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Abandoned and donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.
