An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to accept new public sanitary sewer mains, sanitary sewer manholes, and easements and to adjust three sanitary sewer manholes, for property located at 9828 Split Log Road in Williamson County, also known as Rosebrooke Phase 2 (MWS Project No. 21-SL-224 and Proposal No. 2022M-069ES-001).

WHEREAS, the acceptance of approximately 1,844 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), approximately 3,793 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), 34 sanitary sewer manholes and easements and the adjustment of three sanitary sewer manholes, for property located at 9828 Split Log Road in Williamson County, also known as Rosebrooke Section 2, is needed to construct project number 21-SL-224; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2022M-069ES-001 on April 29, 2022, for the acceptance and adjustment of said sanitary sewer mains, sanitary sewer manholes, and easements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to accept approximately 1,844 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), approximately 3,793 linear feet of

new eight inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), 34 sanitary sewer manholes and easements and to adjustment three sanitary sewer manholes, for property located at 9828 Split Log Road in Williamson County, also known as Rosebrooke Section 2, as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the acceptance and adjustment authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

#### Analysis

This ordinance accepts approximately 1,844 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), approximately 3,793 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), 34 sanitary sewer manholes and easements and adjusts three sanitary sewer manholes for property located at 9828 Split Log Road in Williamson County, also known as Rosebrooke Section 2.

This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission. Future amendments to this ordinance may be approved by resolution.

*Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.*
