An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to accept new public water and sanitary sewer mains, fire hydrant assemblies, sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for property located at 3500 Brick Church Pike, also known as Thornton Grove Phase 4B, (MWS Project Nos. 23-WL-17 and 23-SL-30 and Proposal No. 2023M-155ES-001).

WHEREAS, the acceptance of approximately 1,363 linear feet of new eight-inch water main (DIP), approximately 1,025 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), approximately 329 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), three fire hydrant assemblies, 11 sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for property located at 3500 Brick Church Pike, also known as Thornton Grove Phase 4B, is needed to construct project numbers 23-WL-17 and 23-SL-30; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2023M-155ES-001 on October 11, 2023, for the acceptance of a said water and sanitary sewer mains, fire hydrant assemblies, sanitary sewer manholes and easements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to accept approximately 1,363 linear feet of new eight-inch water main (DIP), approximately 1,025 linear feet of new

eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), approximately 329 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), three fire hydrant assemblies, 11 sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for property located at 3500 Brick Church Pike, also known as Thornton Grove Phase 4B, as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This ordinance accepts approximately 1,363 linear feet of new eight-inch water main (DIP), approximately 1,025 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), approximately 329 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), three fire hydrant assemblies, 11 sanitary sewer manholes and easements for property located at 3500 Brick Church Pike, also known as Thornton Grove Phase 4B.

This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission. Future amendments to this ordinance may be approved by resolution.

Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.
