WHEREAS, the Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee approved rules and guidelines, attached hereto, for the participatory budgeting process at its initial meeting on August 27, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, public events and community meetings involving Bordeaux/North Nashville residents, the Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee, and volunteer Budget Delegates will occur regularly throughout the calendar year until a final list of capital projects is presented to the Bordeaux/North Nashville residents for a vote; and,

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that following the community vote, the selected capital projects will be presented to the Metropolitan Government for action, as needed; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Council desires to recognize the work of the Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee and the Bordeaux/North Nashville Participatory Budgeting Guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the Metropolitan Council hereby goes on record as recognizing the work of the Steering Committee and the Bordeaux/North Nashville Participatory Budgeting Guidelines, attached hereto.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.
