A resolution accepting an in-kind grant from the Friends of Woodmont Park to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to provide improvements to the basketball court at Woodmont Park.

WHEREAS, the Friends Woodmont Park have awarded an in-kind grant, with an estimated value of \$45,000.00 with no cash match required, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to provide improvements to the basketball court at Woodmont Park; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this in-kind grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the in-kind grant by and between the Friends of Woodmont Park, with an estimated value of \$45,000.00, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to provide improvements to the basketball court at Woodmont Park, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That this in-kind grant be appropriated to the Metropolitan Nashville Parks and Recreation Department based on the revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This resolution accepts an in-kind grant from the Friends of Woodmont Park to the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation. This grant has an estimated value of \$45,000 with no local match required. The grant will be used to provide improvements to the basketball court at Woodmont Park. Improvements will include leveling, replacing, and enlarging the current court surface; reorienting the court; installing additional goals on the court; and painting stripes on the court to allow for other game uses.
