

## Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, TN

## **Legislation Text**

An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to accept new public sanitary sewer main and sanitary sewer manholes, for property located at Hart Lane (unnumbered), (MWS Project No. 23-SL-14 and Proposal No. 2023M-107ES-001).

WHEREAS, the acceptance of approximately 421 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC) and two sanitary sewer manholes, for property located at Hart Lane (unnumbered), is needed to construct project number 23-SL-14; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2023M-107ES -001 on July 21, 2023, for the acceptance of said sanitary sewer main and sanitary sewer manholes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to accept approximately 421 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC) and two sanitary sewer manholes, for property located at Hart Lane (unnumbered), as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

## <u>Analysis</u>

This ordinance accepts approximately 421 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC) and two sanitary sewer manholes for property located at Hart Lane (unnumbered).

This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission. Future amendments to this ordinance may be approved by resolution.

Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.
