

Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, TN

An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to abandon easement rights for property located at 636 Division Street, formerly a portion of Allison Street and Alley No. 200 (Proposal No. 2023M-178ES-001).

WHEREAS, easement rights that were retained by Council Bill No. O76-188, for existing utilities, located at 636 Division Street, formerly a portion of Allison Street and Alley No. 200, are no longer needed; and,

WHEREAS, the abandonment has been requested by Albion 636 Division, LLC, owner; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2023M-178ES-001 on November 20, 2023, for the abandonment of said easements rights.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to abandon easement rights that were retained by Council Bill No. O76-188, for existing utilities, for property located at 636 Division Street, formerly a portion of Allison Street and Alley No. 200, as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the abandonment authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This ordinance abandons easement rights that were retained by Council Bill No. O76-188 for existing utilities for property located at 636 Division Street, formerly a portion of Allison Street and Alley No. 200.

This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission. Future amendments to this ordinance may be approved by resolution.

Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Abandoned easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.
