A resolution accepting an in-kind grant from the Friends of Shelby Park & Bottoms to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for the purchase and installation of a boardwalk on the Shelby Park Events Lawn Loop.

WHEREAS, the Friends of Shelby Park & Bottoms have awarded an in-kind grant, with an estimated value not to exceed \$42,000.00 with no cash match required, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for the purchase and installation of a boardwalk on the Shelby Park Events Lawn Loop; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this in-kind grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the in-kind grant by and between the Friends of Shelby Park & Bottoms, with an estimated value not to exceed \$42,000.00, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for the purchase and installation of a boardwalk on the Shelby Park Events Lawn Loop, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That this in-kind grant be appropriated to the Metro Nashville Parks Department based on the revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This resolution accepts an in-kind grant from the Friends of Shelby Park & Bottoms to the Metro Board of Parks and Recreation with an estimated value not to exceed \$42,000 with no cash match required. This grant will provide for the purchase and installation of a boardwalk on the Shelby Park Events Lawn Loop. This was approved by the Board of Parks and Recreation at its February 7, 2023 meeting.
