A resolution accepting an in-kind grant from Creative Parks Nashville to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for improvements to the Centennial Arts Center shed roof project.

WHEREAS, Creative Parks Nashville has awarded an in-kind grant, with an estimated value of \$4,000.00 with no cash match required, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for improvements to the Centennial Arts Center shed roof project; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this in-kind grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the in-kind grant by and between Creative Parks Nashville, with an estimated value of \$4,000.00, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for improvements to the Centennial Arts Center shed roof project, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That this in-kind grant be appropriated to the Metropolitan Nashville Parks and Recreation Department based on the revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This resolution accepts an in-kind grant from Creative Parks Nashville to the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation. This grant is for improvements to the Centennial Arts Center shed roof project, including electrical installation and the additional of an industrial ceiling fan. The estimated value of this in-kind grant is \$4,000. Improvements will be paid for directly by Creative Parks Nashville. This has been approved by the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation.
