A resolution accepting an in-kind grant from the Dalton Family to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for a bench with a plaque honoring their parents to be placed on the west end of the walking loop at Parmer Park.

WHEREAS, the Dalton Family has awarded an in-kind grant with an estimated value of \$2,251 with no cash match required to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for a bench with a plaque honoring their parents to be placed on the west end of the walking loop at Parmer Park; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this in-kind grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the in-kind grant by and between the Dalton Family, with an estimated value of \$2,251, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, for a bench with a plaque honoring their parents to be placed on the west end of the walking loop at Parmer Park, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That this in-kind grant be appropriated to the Metropolitan Nashville Parks and Recreation Department based on the revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

### Analysis

This resolution accepts an in-kind grant from the Dalton Family to the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation with an estimated value of \$2,251 with no cash match required. This in-kind grant provides a bench to be placed on the west end of the walking loop of Parmer Park in Belle Meade with a plaque in honor of the Dalton Family's 94-year-old parents who walk in the park.

This was approved by the Board of Parks and Recreation on November 7, 2023.
