

## Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, TN

## **Legislation Text**

A resolution accepting a grant from the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, to update emission inventory software for the ongoing collection of data on ambient air concentrations for fine particulate matter in Nashville, Tennessee.

WHEREAS, the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency seeks to direct Inflation Reduction Act grant funds, in an amount not to exceed \$64,825.00 with no cash match required, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, to update emission inventory software for the ongoing collection of data on ambient air concentrations for fine particulate matter in Nashville, Tennessee; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this grant be accepted; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the grant by and between the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency, in an amount not to exceed \$64,825.00, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, to update emission inventory software for the ongoing collection of data on ambient air concentrations for fine particulate matter in Nashville, Tennessee, a copy of which grant is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the amount of this grant is to be appropriated to the Department of Health based on revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

## Analysis

This resolution accepts a grant from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to the Metropolitan Board of Health in an amount not to exceed \$64,825 with no cash match required. This grant will be used to purchase the State and Local Emission Inventory System (SLEIS) to replace the current emission inventory software and hardware. The grant period begins on June 1, 2023, and ends on May 31, 2026.
