A resolution appropriating a total of \$25,000 from the Juvenile Court to The Center for Health Policy/Meharry Medical College, a nonprofit organization selected to receive Community Partnership Fund grants.

WHEREAS, Section 7-3-314 of the Tennessee Code Annotated states that metropolitan forms of government may provide financial assistance to nonprofit organizations in accordance with the guidelines of the Metropolitan Government; and,

WHEREAS, Section 5.04.070 of the Metropolitan Code of Laws provides that the Council may, by Resolution, appropriate funds for the financial aid of nonprofit organizations; and,

WHEREAS, the Juvenile Court has accepted applications from nonprofit organizations to receive Community Partnership Fund grants; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor has accepted the recommendation of the Juvenile Court that \$25,000 in Community Partnership Fund grants should be disbursed to the Center for Health Policy/ Meharry Medical College, a nonprofit organization, for their Choosing How I Lead Life (C.H.I.L.L.) program that provides a collaborative public health approach to address youth violence; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that these funds be appropriated to the Center for Health Policy/ Meharry Medical College.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated \$25,000 from the Juvenile Court to Center for Health Policy/ Meharry Medical College for their Choosing How I Lead Life (C.H.I.L.L.) program that provides mentoring services to Davidson County runaway female youth.

Section 2. The grant contract between the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County and to the Center for Health Policy/Meharry Medical College, a nonprofit organization, for their Choosing How I Lead Life (C.H.I.L.L.) program that provides a collaborative public health approach to address youth violence, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This resolution appropriates a total of \$25,000 from the Juvenile Court to the Center for Health Policy/Meharry Medical College, a nonprofit organization selected to receive a Community Partnership Fund grant. The Mayor has accepted the recommendation of the Juvenile Court that \$25,000 in Community Partnership Funds be disbursed to the Center for Health Policy/Meharry Medical College, a nonprofit organization, for their Choosing How I Lead Life (C.H.I.L.L.) program that provides a collaborative public health approach to address youth violence.

The term of the grant contract begins July 1, 2023, and ends June 30, 2024.
