A resolution accepting an in-kind grant from the Friends of Sevier Park to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to install a new bi-level water fountain and bottle filler at the Sevier Park Community Center.

WHEREAS, the Friends of Sevier Park have awarded an in-kind grant, with an estimated value not to exceed \$1,500.00 with no cash match required, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to install a new bi-level water fountain and bottle filler at the Sevier Park Community Center; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this in-kind grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the in-kind grant by and between the Friends of Sevier Park, with an estimated value not to exceed \$1,500.00, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to install a new bi-level water fountain and bottle filler at the Sevier Park Community Center, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That this in-kind grant be appropriated to the Metro Nashville Parks Department based on the revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This resolution accepts an in-kind grant from the Friends of Sevier Park to the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation to purchase and installation of a new bi-level water fountain and bottle filler at the Sevier Park Community Center with an estimated value not to exceed \$1,500 and no cash match required.

This was approved by the Board of Parks and Recreation on October 3, 2023.
