A resolution accepting a grant from the Tennessee Titans (Tennessee Football Inc.) to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to launch a Titans NFL Flag League in Spring 2023 with funding to be used for registration fees and scholarships.

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Titans (Tennessee Football Inc.) have awarded a grant in the amount of \$12,355.33 with no cash match required, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to launch a Titans NFL Flag League in Spring 2023 with funding to be used for registration fees and scholarships; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the grant by and between the Tennessee Titans (Tennessee Football Inc.), in the amount of \$12,355.33, and the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to launch a Titans NFL Flag League in Spring 2023 with funding to be used for registration fees and scholarships, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the amount of this grant be appropriated to the Metro Parks and Recreation Department.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This resolution accepts a grant from the Tennessee Titans (Tennessee Football Inc.) to the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation in amount of \$12,355.33 with no cash match required. This grant will be used to launch a Titans NFL Flag League in Spring 2023 and the funding to be used for registration fees and scholarships for children participating in the program. This has been approved by the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation.
