A resolution approving amendment one to a grant from the Music City PrEP Clinic to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, to provide funding to support the U=U Ambassador Project to end the HIV epidemic.

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, previously entered into a grant agreement with the Music City PrEP Clinic to provide funding to support the U=U Ambassador Project to end the HIV epidemic approved by RS2022-1431; and,

WHEREAS, amendment one to the grant agreement extends the end date to December 31, 2023, a copy of which amendment one is attached hereto; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that amendment one be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That amendment one to the grant by and between the Music City PrEP Clinic and the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, to provide funding to support the U=U Ambassador Project to end the HIV epidemic, a copy of which amendment one is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved, and the Metropolitan Mayor is authorized to execute the same.

Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This resolution approves the first amendment to a grant from the Music City PrEP Clinic to the Metropolitan Board of Health, previously approved by Resolution No. RS2022-1431. The original grant amount is \$10,000 with no local cash match required. The grant funds are used to provide funding to support the U=U Ambassador Project to end the HIV epidemic.

The amendment extends the end date of the grant to December 31, 2023, or until the remaining funds are exhausted, to allow time for the remaining grant funds to be used. Of the original \$10,000 grant, approximately \$6,000 remains.
