An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to relocate a public fire hydrant assembly, for property located at 800 Monroe Street (MWS Project No. 22-WL-05 and Proposal No. 2022M-048ES-001).

WHEREAS, the relocation of one public fire hydrant assembly, for property located at 800 Monroe Street, is needed to construct project number 22-WL-05; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2022M-048ES-001 on March 28, 2022, for the relocation of said fire hydrant assembly.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to accept the relocation of one public fire hydrant assembly, for property located at 800 Monroe Street, as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are

authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This ordinance accepts the relocation of one public fire hydrant assembly for property located at 800 Monroe Street.

This has been approved by the Planning Commission. Future amendments to this legislation may be approved by resolution.

Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Abandoned and donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.
