



NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to abandon approximately 660 linear feet of existing eight inch water main and easement, to relocate two fire hydrant assemblies, and to accept approximately 2,173 linear feet of new eight inch water main (DIP), approximately 1,590 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), four fire hydrant assemblies, 10 sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for property located at Ashland City Highway (unnumbered), also known as Eaton Creek Commons Phase 1, as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the abandonment, relocation, and acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This ordinance abandons approximately 660 linear feet of existing eight-inch water main and easement, relocates two fire hydrant assemblies, and accepts approximately 2,173 linear feet of new eight-inch water main (DIP), approximately 1,590 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), four fire hydrant assemblies, 10 sanitary sewer manholes and easements for property located at Ashland City Highway (unnumbered), also known as Eaton Creek Commons Phase 1.

Future amendments to this legislation may be approved by resolution. This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission.
