abandon existing public water main, sanitary sewer main and sanitary sewer manhole, and to accept new public water main, sanitary sewer main and sanitary sewer manhole, for property located at 1801 Patterson Street (MWS Project Nos. 23-WL-20 and 23-SL-36 and Proposal No. 2023M-089ES-001).

An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to abandon existing public water main, sanitary sewer main and sanitary sewer manhole, and to accept new public water main, sanitary sewer main and sanitary sewer manhole, for property located at 1801 Patterson Street (MWS Project Nos. 23-WL-20 and 23-SL-36 and Proposal No. 2023M-089ES-001).

WHEREAS, the abandonment of approximately 404 linear feet of existing six-inch water main, approximately 283 linear feet of existing 15-inch sanitary sewer main (VCP) and one sanitary sewer manhole, and the acceptance of approximately 404 linear feet of new-eight inch water main (DIP), approximately 283 linear feet of new 18-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC) and one sanitary sewer manhole, for property located at 1801 Patterson Street, are needed to construct project numbers 23-WL-20 and 23-SL-36; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2023M-089ES-001 on May 31, 2023, for the abandonment and acceptance of said water main, sanitary sewer main and sanitary sewer manhole.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to abandon approximately 404 linear feet of existing six-inch water main, approximately 283 linear feet of existing 15-inch

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sanitary sewer main (VCP) and one sanitary sewer manhole, and to accept approximately 404 linear feet of new-eight inch water main (DIP), approximately 283 linear feet of new 18-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC) and one sanitary sewer manhole, for property located at 1801 Patterson Street, as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the abandonment and acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This ordinance abandons approximately 404 linear feet of existing six-inch water main, approximately 283 linear feet of existing 15-inch sanitary sewer main (VCP), and one sanitary sewer manhole and accepts of approximately 404 linear feet of new eight-inch water main (DIP), approximately 283 linear feet of new 18-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC) and one sanitary sewer manhole for property located at 1801 Patterson Street.

Future amendments to this legislation may be approved by resolution. This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission.

Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.
