

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. BL2023-49 is hereby amended by deleting Section 1 in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to accept approximately 338 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), approximately 198 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), three sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for property located at Williams Avenue (unnumbered), also known as Williams Retreat Phase 2, Revision 1, as shown below and on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference:

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the acceptance authorized by this resolution.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect upon passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

Ordinance No. BL2023-49 was approved by the Metropolitan Council on November 7, 2023. The ordinance authorized the acceptance of approximately 293 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), approximately 243 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), three sanitary sewer manholes and easement, for property located at 401 East Williams Avenue, also known as Williams Retreat Phase 2. BL2023-49 provides that amendments to the legislation may be approved by resolution.

The proposed resolution would amend BL2023-49, as the previously approved acceptance of approximately 95 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (DIP) has been modified so that 95 feet fewer is needed, and an additional 95 linear feet of new eight-inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), is now needed to construct this project.

These changes have been approved by the Planning Commission.
