

Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, TN

An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to negotiate and accept permanent and temporary easements for the Kipling Drive Stormwater Improvement Project for 13 properties located along Goodbar Drive, Aladdin Drive, and Kipling Drive, (Project No.20-SWC-326 and Proposal No. 2020M-074ES-001).

WHEREAS, the negotiation and acceptance of permanent and temporary easements for 13 properties located along Goodbar Drive, Aladdin Drive, and Kipling Drive are needed to construct MWS Project 20-SWC-326; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2020M-074ES-001 on August 26, 2020, for the negotiation and acceptance of permanent and temporary easements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to negotiate and accept permanent and temporary easements for 13 properties located along Goodbar Drive, Aladdin Drive, and Kipling Drive as shown on Exhibits 1 and 2, which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the negotiations and acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

This ordinance authorizes the acquisition of permanent and temporary easements for the Kipling Drive Stormwater Improvement Project for 13 properties located along Goodbar Drive, Aladdin Drive, and Kipling Drive. Future amendments to this ordinance may be approved by resolution.

This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission.
