

## Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, TN

## **Legislation Text**

A resolution approving amendment one to a contract by and between the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, and the Tennessee Department of Health for Arbovirus Testing of mosquito samples for West Nile Virus.

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, previously entered into a contract with the Tennessee Department of Health for Arbovirus Testing of mosquito samples for West Nile Virus approved by RS2020-422; and,

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the contract to extend the end date of the contract to February 22, 2022 and delete Section C. Payment Terms and Conditions in its entirety and replace it with a new Section C. Payment Terms and Conditions, a copy of which amendment one is attached hereto; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that amendment one be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That amendment one to the contract by and between the Tennessee Department of Health and the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, for Arbovirus Testing of mosquito samples for West Nile Virus, a copy of which amendment one is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved, and the Metropolitan Mayor is authorized to execute the same.

Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

## <u>Analysis</u>

This resolution approves Amendment One to a contract between the Metropolitan Board of Health and the Tennessee Department of Health for arbovirus testing of mosquito samples for West Nile Virus. The original agreement was approved by Resolution No. RS2022-422. Under that agreement, the state tests mosquito samples collected by Metro for West Nile Virus, St. Louis Encephalitis Virus, and Flanders Virus. Metro pays \$2,200 to test an average of 802 mosquito pools.

The resolution under consideration approves an extension of the contract term for one year, from February 28, 2021 to February 28, 2022. It also increases the contract amount to \$10,000 in the 2022 Fiscal Year.
