



Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, TN

An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to accept new sanitary sewer main, sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for seven properties located on Rio Vista Drive, (MWS Project No. 21-SL-81; and Proposal No. 2021M-063ES-001).

WHEREAS, the acceptance of approximately 446 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), four sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for seven properties located on Rio Vista Drive, is needed to construct project number 21-SL-81; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2021M-063ES-001 on August 13, 2021, for the acceptance of said sanitary sewer main, sanitary sewer manholes and easements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to accept approximately 446 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), four sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for seven properties located on Rio Vista Drive, as shown on Exhibits 1 and 2, which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

Analysis

This ordinance accepts approximately 446 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (PVC), four sanitary sewer manholes and easements, for seven properties located on Rio Vista Drive. Future amendments to this ordinance may be made by resolution. This has been approved by the Planning Commission.

Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Metro Water Services.
