A resolution accepting a grant from the National Environmental Health Association (NEHA) to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, for the Food Protection Services Division of the Metro Health Department to complete a self-assessment of nine retail food program standards of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

WHEREAS, the National Environmental Health Association has awarded a grant in an amount not to exceed \$4,484.00 with no cash match required to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, for the Food Protection Services Division of the Metro Health Department to complete a self-assessment of nine retail food program standards of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA); and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the grant by and between the National Environmental Health Association, in an amount not to exceed \$4,484.00, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, for the Food Protection Services Division of the Metro Health Department to complete a self-assessment of nine retail food program standards of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the amount of this grant is to be appropriated to the Metropolitan Department of Health based on the revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

### Analysis

This resolution accepts a grant from the National Environmental Health Association (NEHA) to the Metropolitan Board of Health for the Food Protection Services Division of the Metropolitan Health Department to complete a self-assessment of nine retail food program standards of the Food and Drug Administration.

The grant award is an amount not to exceed \$4,484 with no cash match required. The project period begins February 15, 2022 and ends December 29, 2022.
