

Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, TN

An ordinance authorizing The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County to accept a new sanitary sewer main, sanitary sewer manhole and easements, for properties located at 409 and 411 McAdoo Avenue, (MWS Project No. 22-SL-41 and Proposal No. 2022M-089ES-001).

WHEREAS, the acceptance of approximately 87 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), one sanitary sewer manhole and easements, for properties located at 409 and 411 McAdoo Avenue, is needed to construct project number 22-SL-41; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Commission approved mandatory referral No. 2022M-089ES-001 on June 10, 2022, for the acceptance of said sanitary sewer main, sanitary sewer manhole and easements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County is authorized to accept approximately 87 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), one sanitary sewer manhole and easements, for properties located at 409 and 411 McAdoo Avenue, as shown on Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Directors of Water and Sewerage Services and Public Property Administration are authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the acceptance authorized by this ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation shall be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

<u>Analysis</u>

This ordinance accepts approximately 87 linear feet of new eight inch sanitary sewer main (DIP), one sanitary sewer manhole and easements for properties located at 409 and 411 McAdoo Avenue.

This ordinance has been approved by the Planning Commission. Future amendments to this ordinance may be approved by resolution.

Fiscal Note: This ordinance has no cost to Metro. Donated easements have no market value according to the Department of Water Services.
