

## Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, TN

A resolution accepting a grant from the Nashville Convention & Visitors Corp. to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Nashville Parks and Recreation Department, in support of a Museum Feasibility Study as part of the Fort Negley Master Plan.

WHEREAS, the Nashville Convention & Visitors Corp. has awarded a grant valued at approximately \$25,000.00 with a required cash match of \$25,000.00 to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Nashville Parks and Recreation Department, in support of a Museum Feasibility Study as part of the Fort Negley Master Plan; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this grant be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the grant by and between the Nashville Convention & Visitors Corp., valued at approximately \$25,000.00, to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Nashville Parks and Recreation Department, in support of a Museum Feasibility Study as part of the Fort Negley Master Plan, a copy of which grant is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the amount of this grant be appropriated to the Parks and Recreation Department.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

## Analysis

This resolution accepts a grant from the Nashville Convention & Visitor Corp. to the Metropolitan Nashville Parks and Recreation Department valued at approximately \$25,000 with a required match of \$25,000. This grant is to support a Museum Feasibility Study as part of the Fort Negley Master Plan. The grant is contingent on the successful amendment to the HDLA purchase order for the Fort Negley Master Plan to include the total cost of the feasibility study.

The Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation approved the acceptance of this grant on August 2, 2022.
