A resolution recognizing the 2022 Bordeaux/North Nashville Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee and Process.

WHEREAS, public events and community meetings involving Bordeaux/North Nashville residents, the Bordeaux/North Nashville Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee, and volunteer Budget Delegates have

occurred regularly throughout the year and a final list of capital projects will be presented to the Bordeaux/North Nashville residents for a vote; and,

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that following the community vote, the selected capital projects will be presented to the Metropolitan Government for action, as needed; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Council desires to recognize the work of the Bordeaux/North Nashville Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the Metropolitan Council hereby goes on record as recognizing the work of the 2022 Bordeaux/North Nashville Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee and Process.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.
