A resolution approving amendment one to an in-kind grant from Greenways for Nashville to the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, to fund for improvements to greenway trailhead and signage sites.

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Government, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, previously entered into an in-kind grant agreement with Greenways for Nashville to raise funds for improvements to 30 greenway trailhead and signage sites on the Cumberland River, Mill Creek, Richland Creek, and Seven Mile Creek greenways approved by RS2023-2265; and,

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the in-kind grant agreement to increase the estimated total maximum value from \$270,000 to \$310,000, revise project locations, expand improvements to additional greenways, and extend the project term by two years; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this in-kind grant be accepted.

Dear Members of the Parks Board,

On March 18, 2023, Greenways for Nashville (GfN) requested approval to conduct fundraising and provide an in-kind grant of \$270,000 for improvements to greenway trailhead and signage sites, which was approved by the Parks Board. GfN now requests approval of a grant amendment to revise the terms related to this grant. GfN requests to expand the locations for improvements from specified greenways to all greenway trailhead and signage sites and extending the term of the approval to two years from the date this amendment request is approved. The amendment will allow GfN to continue to fulfill our mission and provide flexibility to GfN and the Greenways Division to work together more efficiently.

GfN will contract directly with vendors, and all work will be completed to the Parks Department's specifications. The value of the in-kind improvements is estimated at no more than \$310,000. No money will be sent to Metro Parks, and there is no match or other obligations to Metro Parks or Metro Government.
